It isn't too early to begin your planning to attend MISGA's WINTER FLING in Fort Myers, "Palm Tree Paradise". In fact, if you don't plan it now, you may be left out. The dates are: February 24th thru February 27th, 1986.

Since only 80 golfers can be accommodated, including MISGA Associates and their wives, the new MISGA Board decided at its meeting on October 23rd that Club Reps, Assistant Club Reps, Board members, and Committee Chairmen should again be given preference for openings until the quota of 80 golfers is reached. This is the same procedure that was followed last year. Since it is quite likely that all of the available places will not be taken by the aforementioned group, any remaining spots will then be open to all MISGA Associates on a first come-first served basis. There will be no club quotas. Applications will be accepted ONLY if postmarked November 15th or later. Mon-golfing wives are welcome and will have a program planned for them. They will not be counted against the 80 figure.

The pricing structure will be as follows: Per couple (2 golfers): \$421.00, including lodging for 5 nights, golf and cart, banquet, and administrative costs; Per couple (1 golfer and 1 non-golfer): \$313.00; Single golfer: \$273.00; Single golfer w/o room: \$128.00.
