FOXFIRE '85

Last Fall three enthusiastic groups of MISGA golfers and their wives visited Foxfire for five days of golf, fun, and relaxation. The first group was there fom Oct. 28 thru Nov. 1, the second from Nov. 4 through Nov. 8, and the third from Nov. 11 thru Nov. 15. The weather was generally good for all three sessions, but the best weather of all was enjoyed by the last group.
