Thanks for participating and let's herefrom you.


MANOR C. C. TO HOST TWO-MAN TEAM TOURNAMENT

ALVIN HAGEN MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT AT LAKEWOOD COUNTRY CLUB

The Lakewood Senior Golf Association (LSGA) held its first annual Al Hagen Memorial Tournament on April 28, 1998. The event was organized to recognize Al's efforts in the creation and development of the Maryland Interclub Senior Golf Association (MISGA) and his contribution to the Lakewood senior's program.

Al Hagen was the virtual "Father of MISGA", a program he was responsible for starting in the fall of 1975. At a meeting with several Country Clubs, the MISGA program was developed. Al, and other interested players, called on more clubs and many quickly joined the growing MISGA organization. Al served as president of MISGA for five years, and was named President Emeritus and Life Member of MISGA in 1982.

A pre-tournament ceremony was held on the first tee and an impressive plaque, dedicated to the memory of Alvin Hagen, 1911-1997, was presented by the LSGA Seniors Commemorative Committee for display in the Lakewood Club House.

C.J. Myers, past President of MISGA and director of Division 4, participated as a guest.

The most impressive moment of the opening ceremony was the reading of a letter from Al's wife Betty. She wrote of the wonderful feeling she had upon hearing of the tournament honoring her husband. She noted that "winning is great, but the love of golf is the drive that is the important quality". Betty eloquently identified the essence of MISGA. A photograph of the plaque and an Al Hagen Memorial Golf cap were sent to Betty.




W. MARKS JAILLITE



HIGHLIGHTS OF ANNUAL MEETING

President George Shenk Called the annual MISGA meeting to order and thanked Duke Rowden and his committee for the excellent meeting arrangements at *Prospect Bay*. He noted that in the coming year the following studies will be conducted:

1. A committee of Directors will be formed to investigate standards that should be required of applicant clubs;

2. The directors will be asked to investigate the role of the Board President with the objective of possibly separating that position from that of Division Director creating an eleventh or tie breaking vote;

3. The Board will also be asked to review the Division makeup, looking at realignment—concepts. Under new business:

1. The revised Constitution and Bylaws, presented by planning committee chairman Warren Dean, was unanimously approved.

2. Bear Creek, outside of Westminster, has been admitted to membership. The Reps are Henry Payne and Charles Richardson. (The next MISGAgram will describe Bear Creek)
