

TWO-MAN TEAM CONCERNS

Three years ago a complaint was made to the MISGA President that the same 30+ handicapers were repeat winners each year in the MISGA TWO-MAN Team Tournaments.

A comparison was made of the Tournament results for 1995 and the previous year. This comparison indicated that there were only two repeat winners with 30+ handicaps: whereas, there were five repeat winners among the lower handicapers.

Recently a complaint was made to the MISGA President that single-digit handicapers had little or no chance of winning any prize money in this tournament.

The results of this year's MISGA tournament and the Division qualifying tournaments plus the 1995 MISGA Tournament were reviewed. Based on this review, it was found that 9 1/2% of those participating were single-digit handicapers and that on the average they won 10 % of the prize money. This indicates that single-digit handicapers are winning their fair share of the prize money in these tournaments.
